### Determination of a Boiling Point - Vernier

The boiling point is the temperature at which the vapor pressure of a liquid equals the external pressure surrounding the liquid. Therefore, the boiling point of a liquid depends on atmospheric pressure. The boiling point becomes lower as the external pressure is reduced.

### 6.1B: Step-by-Step Procedures for Boiling Point Determination

Since the temperature of the vapor will not get appreciably higher than the boiling point as long as it is in the tube with more liquid, the boiling point can be read as the highest temperature achieved as the vapor condenses on the thermometer bulb: put a boiling stone in the mini test tube add about 1/2inch of liquid

ORGANIC LABORATORY TECHNIQUES 5.5.1. •BOILING POINT DETERMINATION. The physical properties of a compound, such as melting point and boiling point can provide useful information which can help in the identification of a sample or to establish its purity. Since the boiling point of an unknown sample under the same conditions (e.g.same pressure) is a constant, a measured boiling point can be compared to known values (e.g. literature value or the measured value of a known sample).

The boiling point of a solution, then, will be greater than the boiling point of the pure solvent because the solution (which has a lowervapor pressure) will need to be heated to a highertemperature in order for the vapor pressure to become equal to the external pressure (i.e., the boiling point).

The boiling point of a substance is a useful physical property for the characterization of pure compounds. A common method for the determination of boiling points as well as separating and purifying volatile liquids, is distillation, which makes use of the specific boiling points, of the liquid components in the mixture.

In the determination of boiling point of water, it is advised to put the bulb of the thermometer above the water rather than in water, it is to: (a) reduce the error due to atmospheric pressure (b) make sure that boiling point is accurate even when water sample contains non-volatile impurities dissolved

### Determination of Boiling Point

H2O exists in three different physical states-solid ice, liquid water and water vapour. In the liquid state, the forces of interaction are less and therefore, water exists as a liquid at room temperature. The boiling point of water is 100 °C, i.e. the vapour pressure of water becomes equal to atmospheric pressure at 100 °C at sea level.

The temperature at which a liquid changes into its vapour state is known as its boiling point. Once a liquid attains its boiling point, the temperature remains same until all the liquid changes into its vapour.
